Welcome

Welcome to the 2019 AGM, my first as NZSA president.

Highlights

This year has seen further activity and development in our traditional areas. I will mention a few highlights:

- The Education committee continues to be very active and influential. Amongst many other activities (see annual report), the Education committee has provided input into the Ministry of Education's NCEA Change Package 2019 and has been instrumental in establishment of an online journal for teachers, [Statistics and Data Science Educator](#), that aims to improve the quality of teaching resources and the designing of tasks.
- The Australian and New Zealand Journal of Statistics ([ANZJS](#)) continues to innovate through the implementation of initiatives such as the appointment of a Social Media Editor (Emi Tanaka) and the upcoming festschrift for Professor Adrian Baddeley.

The Statistical Society of Australia is hosting the [Inaugural Joint Southern Statistical Meeting](#) in Darwin in 2022 (27 June -1 July). The incoming Executive will work through the NZSA's potential involvement in this venture.

What next for the NZSA?

Building on the work of past presidents and committees, I would like to see the NZSA continuing and accelerating its involvement in i) the professional development and mentoring of early career statisticians, ii) thought leadership and activities in the Data Science/Data Analytics areas, iii) recognising and celebrating the achievements of early career, mid-career and established statisticians within New Zealand.
